Extraordinary Disaster Activity Taxes Red Cross Resources

This year, 15 major disasters have left families across the country reeling and American Red Cross resources stretched to the limit. Amid catastrophic floods and raging wildfires, our dedicated volunteers and employees brought hope to people struggling to put their lives back together.

Today, Red Cross workers are again helping people who face devastation from a major disaster—Hurricane Matthew—which damaged or destroyed thousands of homes and brought record flooding to the Carolinas.

Your Support is Needed

The Red Cross estimates* our responses to 2016's numerous major disasters will collectively cost nearly \$87 million, but as of October 26, we've only raised \$53 million to cover these events—a gap of nearly \$34 million. And that's not counting smaller emergencies, such as home fires, which account for most of the nearly 66,000 disasters that we respond to each year.

This work is only possible because donors like you fund the materials, infrastructure and volunteer training that allow us to bring vital relief quickly, when it's needed most. That's why we need your commitment now to help replenish our Disaster Relief resources, including the restocking of our warehouses with relief supplies.

Together, we can ensure that the Red Cross is there with shelter, food, supplies and comfort for people who have lost everything. And with your help, we will support disaster survivors as they face the difficult challenges

*These costs include the logistics, staff and technology expenses that make our services possible. Figures are estimates and could change. An average of 91 cents of every dollar the Red Cross spends is invested in humanitarian services and programs.
